Group's £1,600 Shakespeare donation

Fishguard Musical Theatre Society (FMTS) handed the school a cheque for £1,600 to sponsor the school's entry into the Shakespeare for Schools festival. The school entered the world's largest youth drama festival, which took place at Theatr Mwldan in November. The sponsorship marks a partnership between FMTS and the school, and a reciprocal support agreement allows the theatre group to use the school hall at cost price for future performances.

Rotary Young Writers Competition

Congratulations was extended to Beatrice Hole, Year 8, who in April won the Intermediate competition at the Regional level (South Wales) in the Rotary Young Writer competition. Beatrice's essay was selected as the best piece of writing from

thousands of entries. The title was 'Connections', in which she wrote a very moving piece about her relationship with her late grandfather. Her work was later entered into the National competition. This is an incredible honour, and we are very proud to have a student from Ysgol Bro Gwaun winning this prestigious award.

Rotary Chef Competition

In January, three keen young chefs from Year 10 were fortunate to be able to compete against Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi in the County Final of Rotary Young Chef competition at the school.

7 KS2/3Transition Links

Due to COVID-19, the Family of Schools was only able to meet on two occasions during the year.

The Family of Schools continued to work alongside Ysgol Bro Gwaun staff on crossphase meetings, with an emphasis on Literacy and the New Curriculum.

Due to lockdown, we were not able to hold all Transition Days as calendared for 2019-20. A successful Year 6 Health & Wellbeing week was held in November, in addition to the Annual Year 4, 5 & 6 Open Evening, which was held in the Autumn term.

On the 3rd and 10th July, Year 6 pupils completed classroom based, core and non-core subject taster activities, whilst on 17th July, pupils were familiarized with the school layout, the Google Classroom system, daily procedures and form groupings.

Miss Rhian Lewis, Miss Alana Finn and Ms Emma Bowen held Microsoft Team meetings with Primary schools during lockdown, with a view to liaise with staff regarding prospective pupils. This was an opportunity for them to meet their Form Tutors, Year Progress Manger, and Mr Paul Edwards, Headteacher.

Again, due to lockdown, unfortunately we were not able to hold the Bwrlwm/Bwrlwm Bach project this year, where pupils from Primary schools are invited to Ysgol Bro Gwaun to broaden and improve further their Welsh language skills.

7.1 Main aspects of work undertaken by the Language Unit during the Educational Year 2019-20 – Miss Angharad Thomas

Within the Unit -

- teaching Welsh to KS2 latecomers from within the family of schools two days a week.
- teaching KS2 'follow on'/intermediate learners -one day a week.
- running Radio Bwrlwm Bro Gwaun club to help secondary pupils (1st language & learners) to use their language skills socially and create radio programmes.
- preparing learning resources, translating and liasing with staff of Welsh Department.
 - Unfortunately, we were not able to hold the following days due to COVID-19 -
- arrange bridging days through the medium of Welsh for Year 6 pupils who plan on attending Ysgol Bro Gwaun (last half term before Summer).
- cwrs Bwrlwm (3 weeks) for Year 6 intending to follow mainstream Welsh, and Bwrlwm bach (1 week), for Year 6 pupils intending to follow some mainstream lessons through the medium of Welsh.

Within the family of schools & community

- teaching Welsh at junior schools within the family where need arises under direction of Ms Elin Evans, Welsh Advisor.
- preparing learning resources and aiding with holding courses for teachers from Welsh medium schools within the County.

Within the Secondary School

- supporting the teaching of subjects through the medium of Welsh (3 days)
- supporting the Welsh department (2 days).
- in conjunction with the Urdd, arrange many sports trips and activities.
- working to promote bilingualism within the locality through Cynllun Bro D J.

The Language Unit plays an essential role in developing the school's Cymreictod and in maintaining excellent links with the feeder schools, and its work is much appreciated.

The Work of the Committees 2019-20

10.1 Curriculum, Staffing and Pupils' Activities Committee.

This Academic Year, due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the committee met twice. The planned Summer Term meeting that should have been held in May 2020 had to be cancelled due to Government restrictions.

The highlight of the Autumn Term was the annual School and Community Carol Service held at St. Mary's Church in Fishguard and the highly successful school production of 'Legally Blonde' with was supported by a large community audience over three nights of performance.

The Alternative Curriculum and the Harbwr provision for pupils with complex needs have been instrumental in engaging vulnerable pupils, and improving attendance and self-esteem of targeted pupils. The school continues to provide the pupils with a stimulating and relevant curriculum with a key focus on listening to learners.

Up until 20th March 2020, our pupils enjoyed a variety of extra-curricular activities. However, due to the pandemic and the restrictions on large gatherings, annual events such as the Certificate Evening normally held during the Spring Term

celebrating the successes of our pupils had to be postponed and all school trips planned were cancelled for the remainder of this year.

During the last week of the Summer Term pupils transitioning from the feeder schools were invited to Bro Gwaun. The successful Bwrlwm and Bwrlwm Bach project continues to be an effective provision.

10.2 Finance Committee

The Finance committee met once every half-term during the academic year 2019-20.

A Finance Report and detailed budget explanation notes showing budgets and balances is presented and discussed at each meeting. Every effort to avoid compulsory redundancies during this period of austerity is being made.

This Committee met on 2 occasions during 2019-20. Issues discusses included –

- Walkway to Technology block ongoing.
- Car parking re-mark of car park and zig-zag area to be conducted groundwork completion date delayed – ongoing.
- Hall ceiling and windows in hall, corridor, Gym area and tower block window to be replaced – ongoing.
- Mural work for departments ongoing.
- Link corridor doors automatic sliding door installed.
- Lockdown Procedures/Policy in place.
- Essential maintenance, as necessary.
- Various other Health and Safety issues were highlighted and dealt with during the year.

11.1 Teaching and Learning Activities

GCSE Drama Theatre Visit

In October, Year 10 and 11 GCSE Drama pupils travelled to Swansea to view two performances. The first was a performance of their set text 'Two Faces' by Manon Stefan Ros. This was a unique and fantastic opportunity for pupils to watch their set text being performed, and to gain ideas for staging, acting and technical aspects ready to answer their written examination paper. The second performance was '100'. The pupils will use this performance to write their 'live theatre review' in their written examination paper. Pupils were a credit to the school, and a good time was had by all!

In October, 3 KS4 pupils travelled to Milford Haven Youth Centre to take part in a Road Safety Event. The day was run by the Police, MAWW Fire Service and the Youth Service. The aim of the day was to highlight the dangers of the road, and the consequences of not being a safe road user. The group thoroughly enjoyed their day, and have developed a power-point to educate their fellow pupils the dangers of the road.

STEM trip with Pembrokeshire College at Cardiff Metropolitan University In October, a small group of Year 10 pupils were selected to attend a STEM day at Cardiff Metropolitan University. The day was organised by Pembrokeshire College and it linked into a Level 3 pathway course – Applied Science with Food Science & Nutrition. The University delivered a masterclass in key areas of Food Science, Food Security and Disease prevention. The pupils had a tour of the University, attended a lecture, and also worked in the Food Science laboratory during the visit. Pupils had a great day and enjoyed finding out future careers in Food Science.

Good Food Show - NEC Birmingham

In November, a trip to the Good Food Show at the NEC Birmingham gave Year 11 GCSE Technology students the opportunity to view new and innovative food products that could be used in order to solve the brief for their GCSE Food and Nutrition coursework.

Observing and talking to experts in the food industry, retailing, manufacturing and education, students explored many interesting food products and innovative equipment.

The annual visit to the Good Food Show acts as a platform intended to help inform and inspire students before they formally submit their possible ideas for the practical examination.

Commenting on the value of attending the show, support teacher Mrs Angela Harries said 'The students got so much out of the trip. It was a great opportunity to engage with exciting new products, and they were able to watch many professional chefs including Nadyia Hussein from Bake off fame at work, picking up many tips and skills related to food preparation'.

All students enjoyed the experience, many made exciting purchases and all students came back heavily laden with free samples! A great day was had by all.

Skills Curriculum trip to St Davids Catherdral

In November, fifteen Year 7 pupils travelled to St Davids as part of the YBG skills curriculum on the topic of pilgrimage, where they were guided around the Cathedral by an educational specialist.

In December, Year 11 pupils attended the Choices Event in Pembrokeshire Archives. This event gave pupils the opportunity to discuss their future career ideas with a variety of local businesses and training providers. Pupils took part in driving a virtual reality crane, helped with building a brick wall, and discussed future careers with a wide variety of local and national businesses. It was a very useful and informative event, and the pupils gained a great insight into the opportunities available to them in the future.

The Scholars Programme

In January, a group of 12 students from Years 9 and 10 attended an opening event at Bristol University as part of the Scholars Programme. The aim of 'Scholars' is to challenge pupils to complete an assignment to university standard, whilst also having an insight into university life.

Upon arrival, pupils were introduced to the different people involved in the programme, and the PhD tutor Bridget Kerr. Pupils were advised on college consideration and how to find out what subject and University itself was best. Pupils were also taken on a tour around the different buildings and then took part in their first session, in which different parts of criminology was explained. Everybody enjoyed their day, and pupils showed great interest in both the subject of criminology and the idea of going to University.

Art workshop

In January, a group of pupils from Years 7 and 8 were invited to attend an Art workshop in Fishguard Town Hall. The pupils heard the story of the last military invasion of Great Britain by Revolutionary France during the War. Pupils were amazed and inspired by the 100-foot long tapestry, which has been displayed since 1997. The embroidered tapestry was designed and sewn by around 80 local women. All pupils were engaged with the story, and were given the task of creating various

art works linked to the story. Images from the embroidered tapestry, along with the pupils' vivid imagination meant wonderful art pieces were created. These pieces are displayed in the Gallery at Fishguard Town Hall. Pupils who attended worked on a large banner to represent Ysgol Bro Gwaun, with links to the community and the last invasion. The completed banner was carried during a parade through the town at the end of February.

Lead Creative School Scheme

In January, 16 Year 7 pupils visited Narberth Museum as part of their Lead Creative Schools scheme. This is the third year that the school have been a part of the project, and 2019-20, we worked with Ysgol Bro Ingli pupils, helping them on their first journey with the Lead Creative Schools to develop creative teaching and learning.

This year's focus was to use storytelling, personal and museum objects to explore ways in which they could help to develop personal and creative confidence in extended writing and oracy presentation skills.

As part of this, the group visited Narberth Museum to look at how objects can create and recount stories. Working with the amazingly enthusiastic Michael Harvey, a bilingual Welsh storyteller, Year 7 explored a range of oracy and storytelling skills, adding detail and embellishing their work. We look forward to working with Mr Harvey again in developing and working towards our own personal museum storytelling experience.





Year 9 Careers Day

In January, Year 9 pupils travelled to Pembrokeshire College to join secondary schools in Pembrokeshire for a Careers Day. Pupils were given the opportunity to attend 3 workshops from a variety of nearly 100 different career options. The workshop ranged from childcare, nursing, farm work, beauty, teaching, musicians, engineering, policing, armed forces, sport, coaching - the list goes on and on! It was a fantastic opportunity for pupils to rule in, and rule out, possible careers!

The Great Debate

In February, five Year 8 pupils and one Year 9 pupil took part in the 'RSPCA Great Debate' in County Hall, Haverfordwest. This regional heat project involved pupils aged 11-14 representing their school in debates on animal welfare topics.

The pupils involved gained an understanding of the responsibility we have for animals, as they researched and discussed the issues they debated. They also

learnt about the importance of participating in political processes, and the impact that this can have on animal welfare.

Theatre Trip to Cardiff

In March, the English Department and sixty-seven KS3 and 4 pupils travelled to the New Theatre in Cardiff to view a stage production of 'An Inspector Calls' by JB Priestly, of which pupils are studying as part of their English Literature course.

Shakespeare Schools Performance

In November, 22 pupils from across the year groups put on a performance of Shakespeare's, 'The Merry Wives of Windsor' at The Mwldan Theatre in Cardigan as part of the National Shakespeare Schools Festival.

The play, which is not often performed in this festival, follows the antics of Sir John Falstaff, played by Kyle Collela, as he tries to seduce the 'Merry Wives', played by Neeve Hallett and Tegan Jones. However, the wives discover his plot and turn the tables on him, playing various tricks, which result in him being smuggled out in a basket and thrown in the Thames and being mistaken for a woman and being beaten out of the house by Master Ford, one of the wives' husbands. The cast put on an original performance of this play, using modern music and a range of interesting and imaginative props and costumes, to create a visual and audial extravaganza which led to the unconventional finale where the cast attacked Sir John dressed as fairies to Fatboy Slim's 'Weapon of Choice'.

The school has been involved in the Shakespeare Schools Festival for a number of years, and each year have produced an original and interesting take on Shakespeare's plays, providing excellent opportunities for the pupils to work with professional actors leading up to the performance and have the experience of performing in a theatre to a paying audience.

A special mention needs to go to Joss Lerwill, Tegan Jones and Kyle Collela, who left us at the end of August, and were involved with Shakespeare Schools since Year 7, performing in each play we have taken part in since then. A special mention also needs to go to Ella Merritt, Tomos Davies and Neeve Hallett, who have been strong members of the Shakespeare Schools team, who also left us at the end of August. It has been a pleasure working with such dynamic and capable pupils and they have been an inspiration to the younger cast members.





Ysgol Bro Gwaun Junior Safeguardians

In November, four pupils from the School Council attended a county led, annual Junior Safeguarding conference at The Pembrokeshire Archives. Zoe LaTrobe, Rhys Evans, Rebecca Hall and Christopher Harries participated in a module of 'Keeping Children, Young People and Adults Safe in Pembrokeshire', as well as completing a

workshop with Crime Stoppers Fearless project. Participants proved to be superb advocates for Safeguarding, and excellent ambassadors for the school, returning to share their feedback and raising the profile of National Safeguarding Week.

Skills Cymru Year 10 event

In February, Year 10 travelled to Parc y Scarlets and were given the opportunity to view a vast range of career opportunities along with other pathways open to them, such as Universities and College courses. The event was very well organised, and all Bro Gwaun pupils enjoyed the trip. It was great to see the enthusiasm of the pupils when finding out about their career opportunities. Their behaviour on the trip was impeccable, and they represented themselves and the school incredibly well. We would like to thank all of those involved in planning the day and those who ran the event.

12 The Implementation of the Policy for Pupils with Additional Learning Needs.

(It is a Welsh Office requirement that this section is detailed.)

Ysgol Bro Gwaun Additional Needs policy is a whole school policy.

Full copies of the policy are available from the Additional Needs Co-coordinator, (ALNCO), Miss Rhian Lewis, who is the teacher responsible for the day to day operation of the policy.

1) The Success of the A.L.N. Policy,

The school's A.L.N. policy has ensured support for a number of pupils with general and specific difficulties, in a wide range of activities, and at all ability levels. We continue to be delighted this year with the progress into Further Education of a significant number of pupils with additional needs and congratulate former pupils on their achievements. Once again, we are pleased by our successes at KS4 and KS3.

The school has provided a number of pupils with an alternative pathway to learning. Pupils have taken part in many outdoor initiatives, working closely with the Youth Workers and Cynnydd provision.

Our ALN bases, Harbwr, Enfys, Corlan and Hendre have helped vulnerable students to access education. Many pupils accessing Alternative Curriculum have progressed, succeeded, and have reached their full potential.

For pupils whose Additional Needs had been clearly identified via a Statement, our Additional Learning Needs Coordinator met with the parents and primary school teaching staff in a formal review prior to secondary school entry. Information from primary schools about other pupils who have less severe needs enabled us to plan our level of provision for these children. Similarly, information provided by the parents of new pupils at formal and informal meetings with our ALNCo, School Counsellor, School Nurse, School Inclusion Officer, and Deputy Headteacher, allowed us to make the best preparations to receive new pupils.

Extra Transition visits were put in place for many ALN pupils. Pupils have been tracked, and identified early, to enable interventions to be put in place.

Our policy involves regular assessment for all pupils in school at every stage in their education. Assessment tools differentiated to the needs of individuals and groups are becoming the norm in all areas of the curriculum.

Access arrangements are provided for pupils with specific difficulties during both internal and external assessments, by formal testing. These may take the form of extra time, a less formal setting, a member of staff to act as a reader or word processing facilities, depending on their needs.

Our 'Harbwr' Learning Resource Centre Unit provides a differentiated curriculum for our most complex needs pupils. This has been identified as 'good practice' by the Local Authority, ERW, and Estyn. Pupils access some mainstream lessons for experience purposes. The County's Panel places the pupils in Harbwr, due to their severe needs.

The 'Enfys' class operates within the department, which enables a small group of pupils to benefit from specialized support. Along side this, support is offered within maintstream classes by a combination of Support Teaching Staff and Learning Support Assistants. As pupils progress to Year 9 and beyond, support tends to be within mainstream sets with very little withdrawal, except for pupils following individual programmes of study.

Pupils in Years 7 to 11, who are exempt from one or more languages, followed an individual programme of curriculum enrichment. At KS4, we try to give further subject choices to these pupils to maintain a broad balanced curriculum, in addition to their specific programmes. Some pupils follow an alternative curriculum at KS4 and groups of pupils take advantage of the facilities offered by our Youth Worker and Alternative Curriculum Tutor, and Cynnydd provisions.

The A.L.N. Department operates a monitoring and record keeping policy as described in the Department for Education "Code of Practice". A pupil's Additional Needs are classified according to a 3-stage process: **Action (A), Action Plus (P)** and **Statement (S)**.

- A Action means help within the class by teachers, a plan is in place.
- P Action Plus involves external advice and input to the young person's plan.
- **S Statement** a detailed plan provided by the Local Education Authority (a legal document) which states what the pupil's additional needs are and instructs us on how to meet them.

Pupils with Statements have yearly reviews between November and February, with a "Transition Plan" at age 14 focused on careers and the transition to further education or work. A specialist careers advisor now writes individual career plans for these pupils. All agencies working with the pupils, together with parents or guardians and the pupils are invited to attend the review. New targets are discussed and agreed for the following year. IEPs or IDPs with 'SMART' targets are in place on the newly acquired provision maps.

Consultation -

Extensive use has been made of a number of agencies, such as the Educational Psychology Service, Speech and Language Therapy, Advisory Teachers for Hearing and Visual Impairment and Autistic Spectrum Disorder, CAMHS, Careers Wales, Action for Children and TAF. TAPPAS and SASPs meetings are held every term

with the County.

We gratefully acknowledge the support work of internal agencies, and work closely with the pastoral lead, inclusion officer, the school nurse, school counsellor, Corlan, Hendre, and 'BGRU' provision. We also work with other LRCs and Neyland PLC.

We are grateful for the support of organizations which have enabled pupils to take part in other activities such as Disability Sports competitions.

During the last year, our work in behaviour modification has continued, and can be seen to have had an impact on pupils with significant difficulties. During the year the department has worked extensively to support procedures such as Action Planning and Pastoral Support Programmes for young people with behavioural and/or emotional difficulties.

We also support mainstream teaching staff in offering advice and guidelines on how to support various pupils and how to meet their needs in a mainstream environment.

Finally, we are in constant discussions with parents, and the ALNCo holds regular informed coffee mornings and meetings with parents/guardians to discuss and provide practical support.

3) Resources.

The school's delegated budget provided the resources for the education of pupils with Additional Needs.

4) Pupils with Disabilities

Ysgol Bro Gwaun has an open entry policy. We are a community school and welcome all pupils from the catchment area, who wish to study and develop personally here. We seek to ensure that all pupils have an equal opportunity to access both a balanced curriculum and all school facilities. The Disability Equality Plan and Access Plans are both in place.

Our successful provision ensures inclusion for all pupils at all levels and ages, making it a truly comprehensive school where all pupils are welcomed, valued, cared, and provided for.


Dathliadau Dydd Gŵyl Dewi 2020

Information about new statutory guidance relating to Governing Body meetings with parents

Effective from 4th May, 2013, there is no longer a requirement for governing bodies to hold an Annual Parents' Meeting.

New statutory guidance has been issued by the Welsh Government to this effect (104/2013).

Parents now have the right to request up to three meetings per year with the governing body to discuss issues which concern them. The purpose must be to discuss issues with relate to the school. It cannot be about individual pupil progress, or to air grievances against members of staff or the governing body.
