GCSE Exam Whitsun revision.

Year 8 Pupil Groups.

Parents of pupils in year 8 have received a letter recently outlining our intention to restructure the Year 8 tutor groups after the Whitsun holiday. Please contact the office if you haven't received this letter.

The changing of tutor groups will affect some, but not all pupils. There are a number of good reasons for doing this, which include:

- Ensuring pupils are grouped appropriately for the start of GCSE work which many subjects will begin to teach in September;
- Ensuring that pupils' linguistic progression in relation to Welsh language is supported appropriately;
- Making the groups more even in terms of pupil numbers;
- Establishing positive working dynamics within groups.

Please note that pupils already find themselves in different teaching groups for core subjects such as English, Welsh, Maths and Science. These will not be part of this re-grouping process and will remain largely unchanged.

Attendance.

It is important that your child attends school regularly throughout the year in order to gain the maximum benefit from the education provided. Pupils, in general, attend well and our GCSE outcomes reflect closely our good attendance rates. Our

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current whole-school attendance rate is nearly 92%, and although it is an improving picture, and we do compare well with other schools, this is still below pre-pandemic levels. We do recognise there is more work to do to target the frequent absenteeism of some pupils and we will continue to remind all parents/carers and their child(ren) of the importance of good attendance. Please support us in ensuring your child(ren) make every effort to attend school.

Equipment.

Unfortunately, we are finding that there is an increasing number of pupils who are not bringing equipment such as pens, pencils and rulers to school. Basic equipment such as this is absolutely necessary to ensure pupils can access and complete the set work and to ensure that they perform to the best of their abilities. We kindly ask that you check your child(ren) has the necessary equipment on a regular basis.
